

Why trauma informed practice?

- Royal Commission findings on strengthening services in the early years
- Identified as a priority area for professional development by MCH nurses
- 3. Recognition of the complex families MCH routinely work with and support.

There is still an 'inadequate understanding of the impact of trauma arising from such abuse and violence on the development and functioning of children and young people'.

- Royal Commission into Family Violence, 2016.

Tailored learning to enhance MCH workforce capacity

- Designed and delivered by renowned experts
- Informed by Expert Content Group across 10 disciplines
- Focus Group to capture MCH perspective.

Delivery of comprehensive training package: June-October 2018

- Two days for all MCH staff: Universal, Enhanced and MCH Line
- 1 online; 1 face-to-face, through a sequenced approach
- Online learning through seminars and webinars – June/July

- Face-to-face workshops from Aug-Oct: metro/regional across Victoria, approx. 15
- Evaluation to gauge impact on practice and family outcomes.
