

Refugee Health Innovation Project

- The City of Greater Dandenong is now the most multi-culturally diverse community in Australia
- With residents from over 160 different birthplaces, well over half (64%) of its population are born overseas
- Of these, there are almost 4000 Refugee and Asylum Seekers
- The MCH Innovation fund was in response to local needs and to improve access for these families.



MCH Refugee Health Program

Development of:

- Processes and referral pathways
- Professional Development training including Cultural competency
- 3 4 Outreach home visits and linkages for the families into the Universal Service or Enhanced Service as required
- Resource Manual
- Ensure sustainable change

Getting Started....

Establishment of:

- Central email address and contact point
- Referral form which was distributed to relevant agencies
- Refugee Health Team mobile phone
- Central Refugee Health Outlook Calendar
- Refugee Health Spreadsheet





Intake process

- Referrals received by email
- All families were entered on the spreadsheet and in CDIS
- MCH Refugee Health nurse contacted the families to arrange the first home visit
- Onsite female only Interpreters were arranged
- An SMS reminder is sent 24 hours prior to the visit





First home visit

- ▶ 1-1.5 hours allocated for the home visits
- Importance to double check all family details including family members that may not have come with the family and have been left behind with extended family members!
- Explanation of the MCH service and how we can support the family moving forward
- Confirm second home visit at time of consultation





Follow up visits

- Subsequent visits based on concerns or needs of the family.
- K.A.S. checks attended
- Follow up issues and or referrals
- Begin the process to link the family into the Universal Service
- First centre visit and dependent on the family, the MCH Refugee Health nurse will meet them at the first centre visit
- Or referral into the EMCH service
