Nick McKenzie is an acclaimed Australian investigative journalist, working primarily for Melbourne newspaper The Age and The Sydney Morning Herald. He's presented major investigations for the ABC's Four Corners program, 60 Minutes and the Australian Financial Review.

With two decades experience, Nick has won every major award in Australian journalism, including the nation's highest journalism award, the Walkley, a record 20 times. He's been named Australian Journalist of the Year on four occasions but is best known for his work exposing war criminal Ben Roberts-Smith and, most recently, the CFMEU.

Mr David Wolf is the Chair of the Commission and also acts as Chief Executive Officer. He was previously Deputy Commissioner at IBAC, where he led the public sector portfolio from 2020 to 2024. Rueben Berg is a proud Gunditjmara man and Co-Chair of the First Peoples' Assembly of Victoria. He represents the Eastern Maar Aboriginal Corporation, a Traditional Owner group in south-western Victoria. Rueben is deeply committed to advancing the rights and interests of First Nations people, ensuring that Treaty delivers practical solutions for Aboriginal communities.

His leadership and dedication have earned him widespread respect. Rueben is known for fostering collaboration and understanding among diverse stakeholders. He played a significant role in designing and negotiating the Treaty Negotiation Framework during his first term in the Assembly (2019-2023).

Rueben haś also served on the Heritage Council of Victoria, founded Indigenous Architecture and Design Victoria, and held leadership roles in various organisations, including being the first Aboriginal Chair of a water corporation in Victoria. His extensive experience and commitment to his community make him a highly respected figure in both First Nations and broader communities.



# **Cr Dr Anjalee de Silva**Monash City Council and Lecturer Melbourne School of Law

Dr Anjalee de Silva is a two-term Councillor at the City of Monash, where she also serves on the Gender Equity Advisory Committee. Outside local government, she is a Lecturer at Melbourne Law School and a Women's Leadership Institute of Australia Fellow. She is an expert in administrative, anti-discrimination, and free speech and media law and theory, with a focus on harmful speech and its regulation, particularly in online contexts. In particular, her work examines vilification or 'hate speech' directed at women, as well as the role of law in deterring, regulating, and mitigating the harms of such speech.
