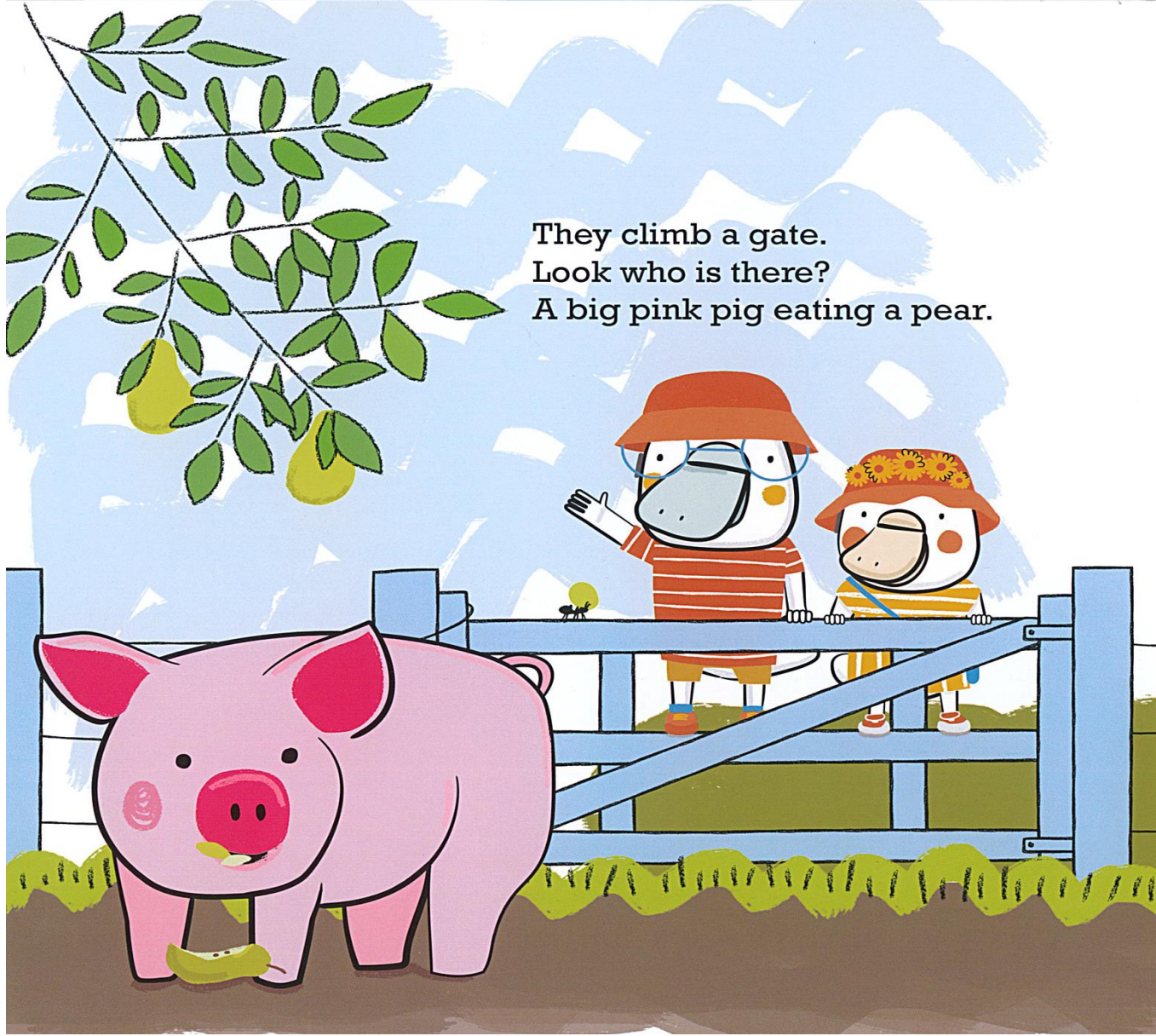




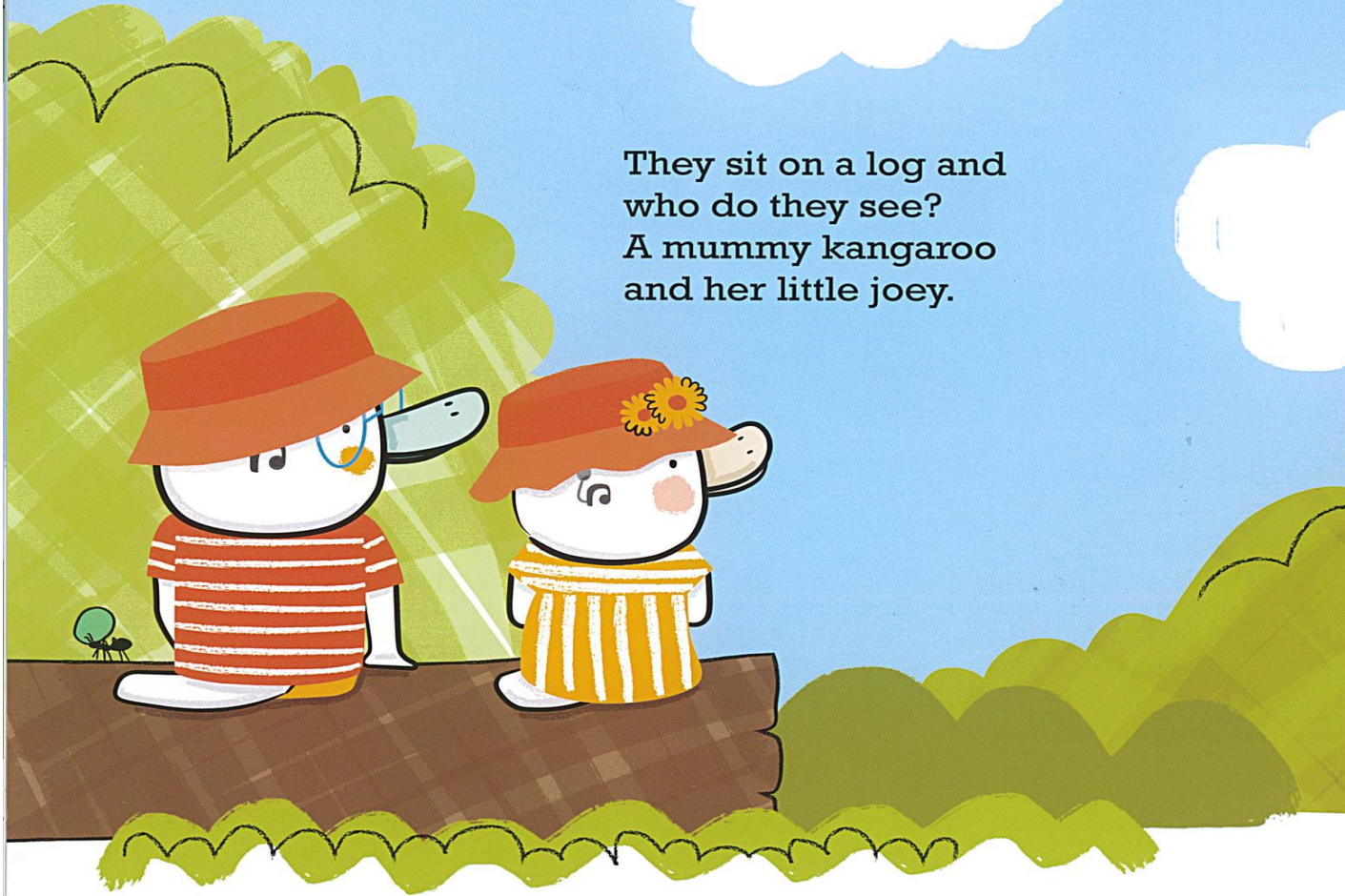
Pip and Annie love to play outside.

for a walk in the countryside.

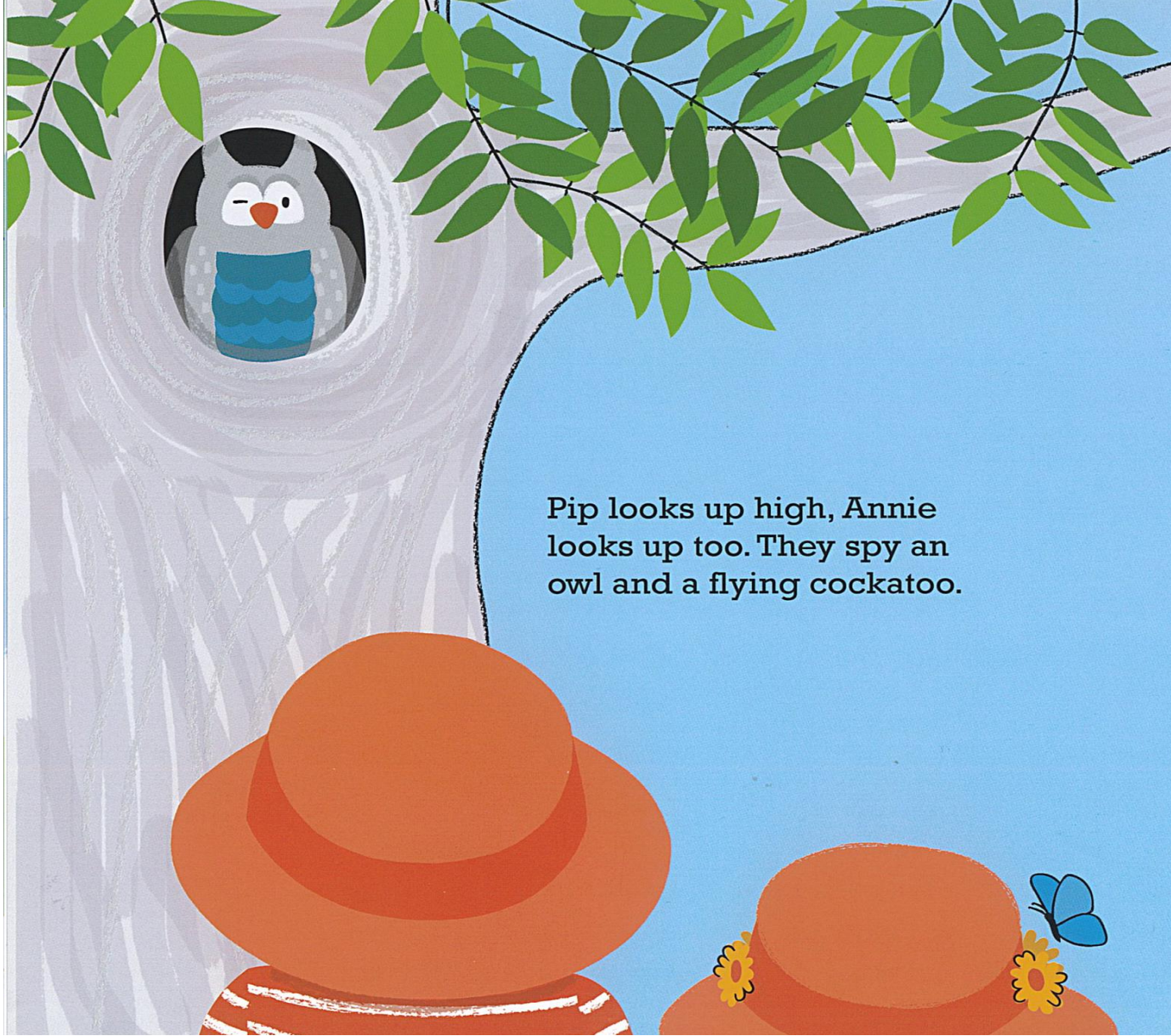


They climb a gate.

A big pink pig eating a pear.

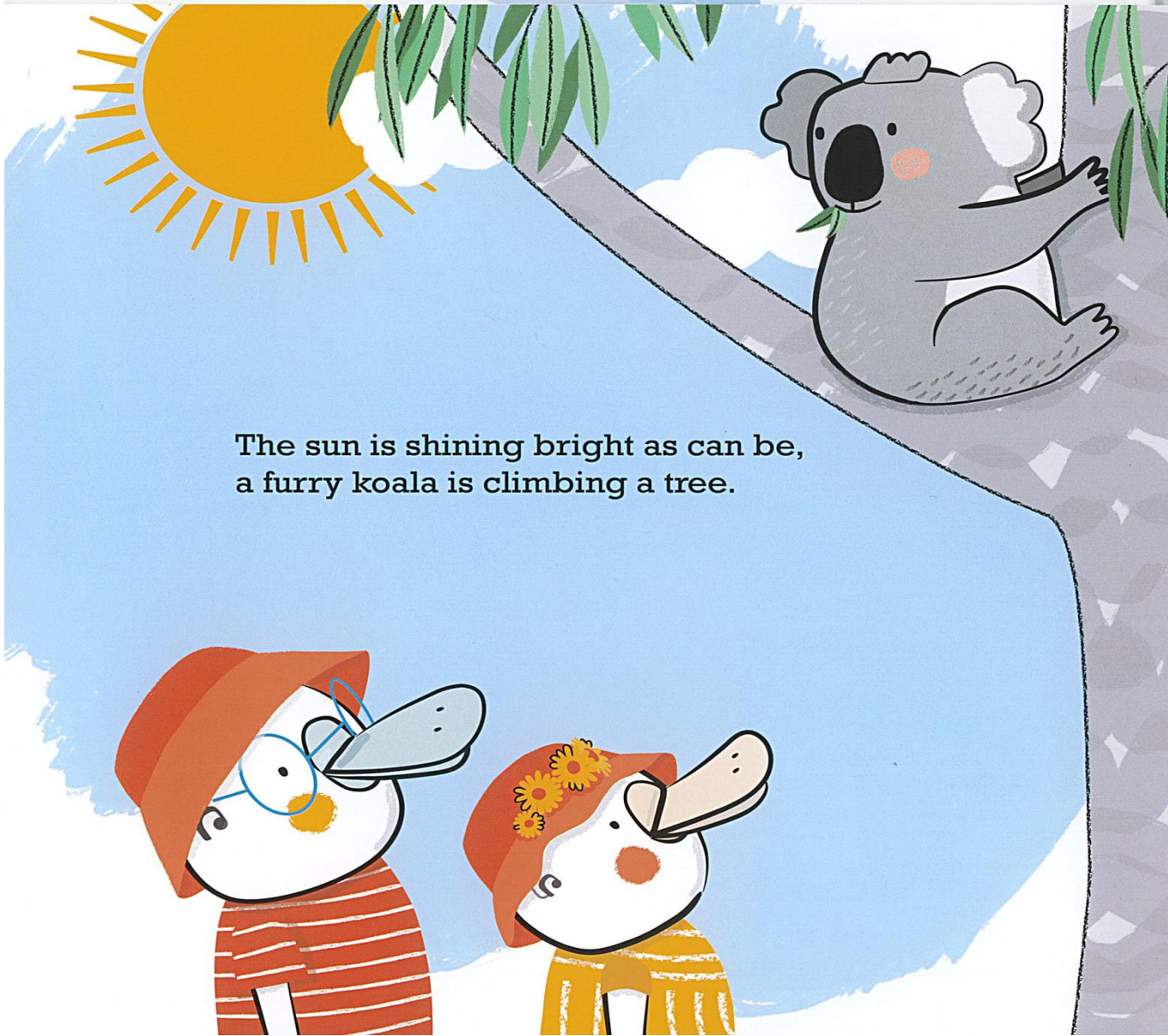


They sit on a log and

and her little joey.



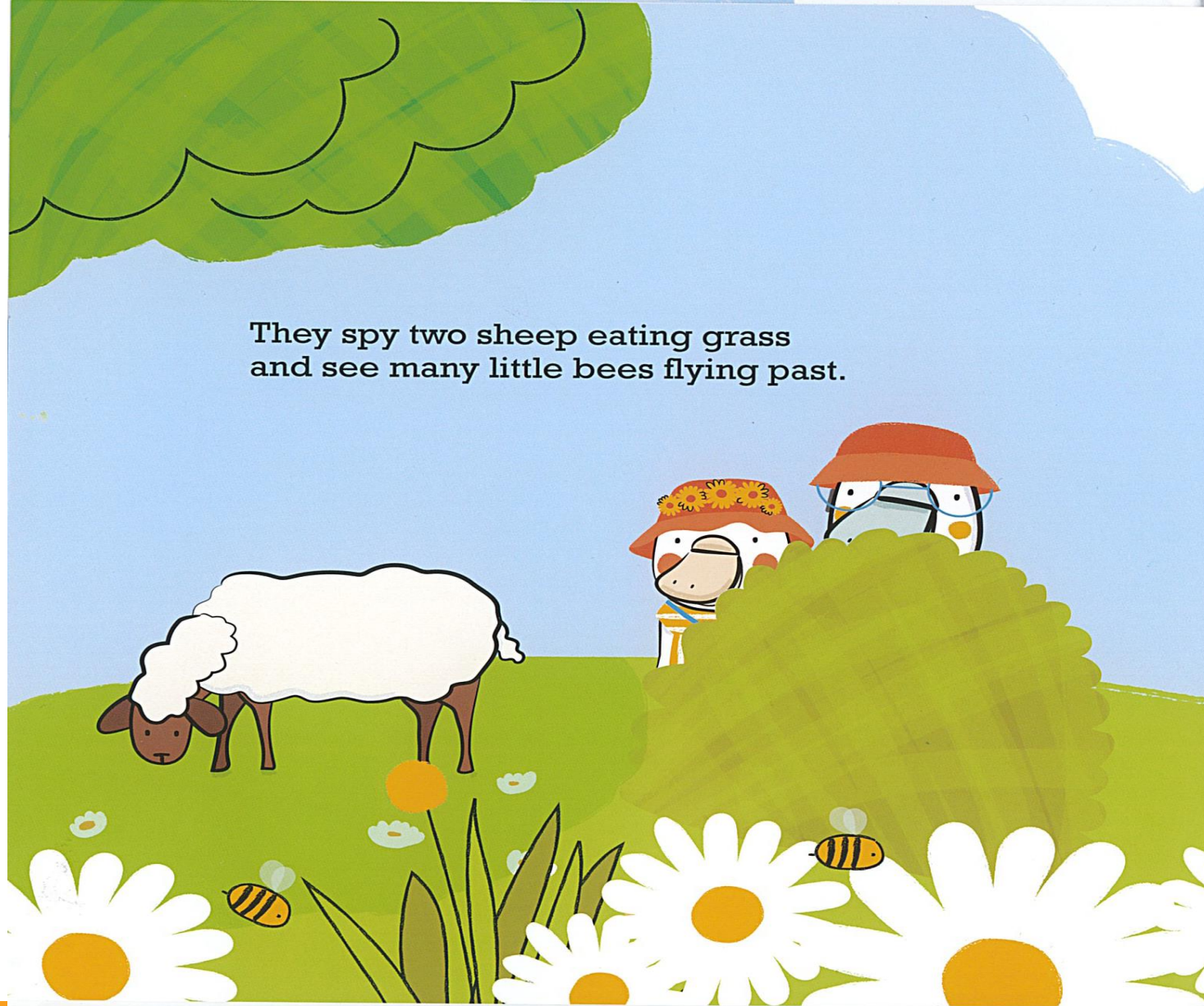


Pip looks up high, Annie
