Applications

Course applications for mid-year entry open on the 1st of April, and 2026 applications open on the 1st of August. This is the link for all applications: Apply directly - Postgraduate, Study with us, La Trobe University.

You must be a registered Nurse and Midwife and have at least one year of nursing and one year of midwifery experience (two full-time years). Applicants with at least five years in either Nursing or Midwifery may also be admitted. You must also have a confirmed clinical place in a Maternal and Child Health service.

Most places at La Trobe are Commonwealth-supported places (CSP), with some fee-paying places available.

Course structure

The Graduate Diploma in Child, Family, and Community Nursing comprises 120 credit points – 90 credit points of core subjects and 30 credit points of electives.

Core subjects in semester 1 are:

- NSM4MCH Maternal and Child Health
- NSM4CCH Community Child Health
- NSM5CAF Nurturing Child and Family

In semester 2, you will enrol in

- NSM5COM Complex Care in Maternal and Child Health
- · Electives, unless you have credit for them

Timetable

Online contact with your lecturers will occur through regular scheduled online "lectures" (via Zoom). Although these sessions are recorded, it is best to attend the live session.

Generally, they are held on Thursdays from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm or from 2:00 to 4:00 pm (not every week).

Electives

Elective options may include:

- NSM4REM Research and Evidence in Midwifery (15 credit points, week 06-26) commences early.
- NSM4IPH Indigenous Perinatal Health subject (15 credit points, week 27-44) commences early
- NSM5RES Research in Nursing and Midwifery
 (30 credit points, semester 1 or 2)
- NSM5RFN Research in Nursing (15 credit points, semester 1 or 2)

Or external electives (each equivalent to 15 credit points):

- Nurse Immuniser Program <u>Australian Catholic</u> <u>University</u>, or <u>The University of Melbourne</u>, or <u>ACN</u>
- <u>The Australasian Lactation Course</u> (or other approved lactation studies)
- <u>Comprehensive Sexual and Reproductive Health</u> (Nursing) course

- Other approved postgraduate subjects.. Please check with the course coordinator before enrolling in external electives that are not on this list.

Credit for electives

You can apply for credit for up to 30 credit points if you have completed postgraduate studies within the last eight years, which may include the Postgraduate Diploma in Midwifery.
