
Zelda D'Aprano fought fiercely for pay equity throughout her work at the Australian Meat Industry Employees Union. She was a key feminist in the Women's Liberation



Bass Coast Council - Public Place Naming & Commemoration

The issue/opportunity:

Public place naming and commemoration has been historically been dominated by men

Evidence & Analysis:

- •60 localities 44 non gender specific, 16 male, 0 female 0%
- •1521 roads 1246 non gender specific, 182 male, 93 female 6%/34%
- •111 features (to date) 62 non gender specific, 41 male, 8 female 7%/16%
- Only 1% statues in Melbourne feature historic women
- \$100 per sign theres also an investment gap

Recommendation:

- Develop a list of historically significant women
- •Work with community and developers to increase road and park names after women

- new or up for review
- have a direct and significant impact on the public
