

The 2025 MAV Annual Conference is an event you'll remember.


Together we'll connect, learn, and be inspired through a dynamic program of keynotes, panels, workshops, and conversations designed to spark collaboration and courage.





Mr Andrew Colvin AO APM
Chief Executive Officer Australian Red Cross

Andrew Colvin AO APM brings to Australian Red Cross a deep understanding of crisis management and leadership capabilities that will play a critical role as the organisation responds to the evolving needs of communities across Australia and beyond.

With a career dedicated to public service, Andrew has played leadership roles during some of Australia's most high-profile incidents and events.
